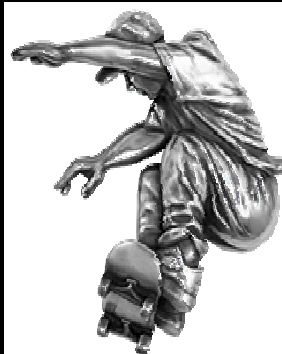

Same Services, Another Door

Although the Borough of Merchantville is not growing by leaps and bounds, a need for additional office space for Borough employees surfaced and provided an excellent opportunity for a better organization by function. The old police garage has been undergoing renovations into office space and will house various staff, all of whom provide community services. You will still pay your taxes, sewer charges, and parking fines in the Borough Hall, but now the Community Services Annex will be where you can inquire about zoning variances, apply for a building permit, find out what's going on in the West End, or get help with the myriad of items that fall under "community affairs".

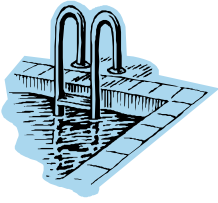
The new office is completed and furniture will be installed in mid July. The entrance is on West Park, although you can park on Maple or Centre and walk around the building. There is no internal access from the main building to the annex.

The following service departments should be fully operational in their new daytime home by August 1:

- Zoning and Code Enforcement - Walt Sikorski
- Building Construction - Bill Joseph
- Neighborhood Preservation Program - Denise Brouse
- Community Affairs - Fred Koehler

There is other good news! The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs selected Merchantville as a recipient of a Livable Communities grant of \$190,000 that covers almost all of the building renovation costs. The Borough applied for the grant so we could take advantage of a unique funding opportunity that fit nicely with our needs and our desire to continue to make Borough services accessible to the public in a friendly atmosphere.

PARENT/GUARDIAN REMINDER ABOUT EVENING CURFEWS

Admiral William J. Fallon, Commander, U.S. Pacific Command

Admiral William J. Fallon was raised in Merchantville, N.J. A 1967 graduate of Villanova University, he received his commission through the Navy ROTC Program and was designated a naval flight officer upon completion of flight training in December 1967.

Adm. Fallon began his Naval Aviation service flying in the RA-5C Vigilante with a combat deployment to Vietnam, transitioning to the A-6 Intruder in 1974. He served in flying assignments with Attack Squadrons and Carrier Air Wings for twenty-four years, deploying to the Mediterranean Sea, Atlantic, Pacific and Indian Oceans embarked in USS Saratoga, USS Ranger, USS Nimitz, USS Dwight D. Eisenhower and USS Theodore Roosevelt. He has logged more than 1,300 carrier arrested landings and 4,800 flight hours in tactical jet aircraft.

Adm. Fallon commanded Attack Squadron Sixty Five embarked in USS Dwight D. Eisenhower, Medium Attack Wing One at NAS Oceana, Va., and Carrier Air Wing Eight in USS Theodore Roosevelt during a combat deployment to the Arabian Gulf for Operation Desert Storm in 1991. Assigned as Commander, Carrier Group Eight in 1995, he deployed to the Mediterranean as Commander, Theodore Roosevelt Battle Group and commanded Battle Force Sixth Fleet (CTF 60) during NATO's combat Operation Deliberate Force in Bosnia. Adm. Fallon served as Commander, Second Fleet and Commander, Striking Fleet Atlantic from November 1997 to September 2000. He was then assigned as Deputy and Chief of Staff, U.S. Atlantic Fleet followed by assignment as Deputy Commander in Chief and Chief of Staff, U.S. Atlantic Command. Admiral Fallon served as the 31st Vice Chief of Naval Operations from October 2000 to August 2003. He was the Commander, U.S. Fleet Forces Command and U.S. Atlantic Fleet from October 2003 to February 2005.

Adm. Fallon is a graduate of the Naval War College, Newport, R.I., the National War College in Washington, D.C., and has a Master of Arts degree in International Studies from Old Dominion University. His awards include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal, Navy Commendation Medal, and various unit and campaign decorations.

Helpful Hints For Fresh Cut Flowers: Keep the vase filled with water containing floral food provided by your florist. Be sure to follow the directions on the package. If the solution becomes cloudy, replace it entirely. If possible, recut the stems by removing one to two inches with a sharp knife. Remove leaves that will be below the waterline. Leaves in water will promote bacterial growth that can harm the flowers.

This first meeting was held at the Collins House (our thanks for supplying the meeting room) on June 8 at 7:00 PM with refreshments served by the Collins House staff and donated by the Merchantville Business and Professional Association.

The tone of the meeting was very positive toward the concept of an organized body created with sufficient funding to provide a vehicle for the business community to encourage the economic vitality of its business members. Twenty-one people attended, which was a good turn-out for an initial meeting, but broader participation is important to insure the BID meets the needs of the entire business community. Members of the BID steering Committee worked hard to try to visit every business and invite them to the meeting. An invitation was also mailed to every owner of a business property.

This meeting will get into more detailed discussion and input about what needs to be done and how on-going operations will be funded. 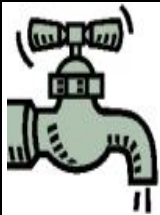

BORO FAST FAQs:

As of the census of 2000, there are 3,801 people, 1,524 households, and 946 families residing in the borough. The population density is 6,317.2/ mi². There are 1,607 housing units at an average density of 2,670.8/ mi².

The racial makeup of the borough is 85.90% White, 7.42% African American, 0.29% Native American, 2.10% Asian, 0.00% Pacific Islander, 2.84% from other races, and 1.45% from two or more races. 5.47% of the population are Hispanic or Latino of any race.

There are 1,524 households out of which 32.1% have children under the age of 18 living with them, 45.1% are married couples living together, 12.9% have a female householder with no husband present, and 37.9% are non-families. 32.0% of all households are made up of individuals and 11.6% have someone living alone who is 65 years of age or older. - Sidewalks and curbs should never be cleaned with the hose.
- Sprinklers should be set so as not to waste water on sidewalks or streets
- Never wash your car or truck without using an automatic shut off nozzle
- If you have a pool, cover it when not in use to minimize evaporation
- When watering your lawns do not do it during the hottest hours of the day. Early morning is the best time

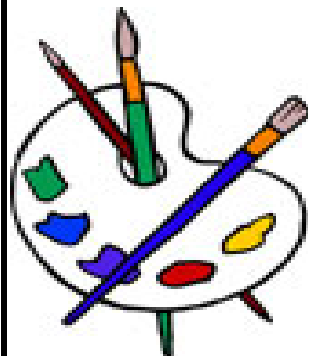
